## THURSDAY PRAYER GUIDE | FEAST OF TRUMPETS (Leviticus 23:9-14)

The **Feast of Trumpets** can be summed up in one word "regathering." The Fall Festivals serve as a way of reminder to regather to a pure faith in God, and Rosh HaShanah has come to represent the day of repentance. This is when the people of God take an examination of their inward spiritual condition and make any changes necessary to insure the upcoming new year will be honoring to God. This feast is a landmark day of rest, sacred assembly, and sacrifice. It is a day to pause, reflect, and prepare for the great festivals which are approaching, namely, the Day of Atonement and the Feast of Tabernacles.

The LORD spoke to Moses: "Tell the Israelites: In the seventh month, on the first day of the month, you are to have a day of complete rest, commemoration, and trumpet blasts—a sacred assembly. You must not do any daily work, but you must present a food offering to the LORD

## PRAYER POINTS: GRATEFUL HE IS RETURNING AGAIN

- 1. Pray for God to give you a Sabbath heart of rest to slow down and reflect on God and all that He is revealing to you.
- 2. Ask God to help you set apart one day each week to cease from the busyness and feast on God's Word.
- 3. Pray for a renewal of the mind, so we can remember the good, perfect, pleasing will of God (Rom 12:1-2). Pray for hearts to align to His will and for His kingdom to come.
- 4. **Praise** God that He is faithful to fulfill all His promises. Take each promise and turn it into a prayer of thanksgiving.

Jesus promised rest (<u>Matthew 11:28–30</u>). Burdens are lifted at Calvary.

Jesus promised <u>abundant life</u> to those who follow Him (<u>John 10:10</u>). Following Jesus brings us more spiritual fulfillment than we could have anticipated. We leave boring behind.

Jesus promised eternal life to those who trust Him (John 4:14).

The Good Shepherd also promised to hold us securely: "No one will snatch them out of my hand" (John 10:28).

Jesus promised His disciples power from on high (<u>Acts 1:8</u>). In this power, they "turned the world upside down" (<u>Acts 17:6, ESV</u>).

Jesus promised that He will return for us (John 14:2–3). From then on, we will be with Him always.
