## April 8, 2015 "Why Does God Allow Suffering?" (pt. 2) 2 Corinthians 12:1-10

- 1) Keep a Heavenly Perspective "I know that this man...was caught up into paradise." (3)
- 2) Use Trials for Growth "Therefore, so that I would not exalt myself..." (7; 1 Peter 1:6-7; James 1:12)
- 3) Know that Satan Attacks Moving Targets "a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan" (7b)
- 4) Take it to the Lord in Prayer "Concerning this, I pleaded with the Lord three times to take it away from me." (8)
  - a) God can provide healing
  - b) God honors repeated requests
  - c) God always answers: "no", "slow", "grow", "go"
- 5) Rely on His Strength "But He said to me, 'My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness.' Therefore, I will most gladly boast all the more about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may reside in me. So I take pleasure in weaknesses, insults, catastrophes, persecutions, and in pressures, because of Christ. For when I am weak, then I am strong." (9-10)

**2Co 12:1-10** "It is doubtless not profitable for me to boast. I will come to visions and revelations of the Lord: (2) I know a man in Christ who fourteen years ago—whether in the body I do not know, or whether out of the body I do not know, God knows—such a one was caught up to the third heaven. (3) And I know such a man—whether in the body or out of the body I do not know, God knows— (4) how he was caught up into Paradise and heard inexpressible words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter. (5) Of such a one I will boast; yet of myself I will not boast, except in my infirmities. (6) For though I might desire to boast, I will not be a fool; for I will speak the truth. But I refrain, lest anyone should think of me above what he sees me *to be* or hears from me. (7) And lest I should be exalted above measure by the abundance of the revelations, a thorn in the flesh was given to me, a messenger of Satan to buffet me, lest I be exalted above measure. (8) Concerning this thing I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might depart from me. (9) And He said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for My strength is made perfect in weakness." Therefore most gladly I will rather boast in

my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. (10) Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ's sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong."

**1Pe 1:6-7** "In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, (7) that the genuineness of your faith, *being* much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ."

**Jas 1:12** "Blessed *is* the man who endures temptation; for when he has been approved, he will receive the crown of life which the Lord has promised to those who love Him."
