## April 10, 2019 "How do we Know that the Easter Story is True?" Matthew 28:1-10 David Self

## I. Christ's Resurrection Casts Out Fear

"Don't be afraid..." (5) In I John 4:18 we read "...perfect love drives out fear." "So, departing quickly from the tomb with fear..." (8)

- A. When "the first day of the week" (1)
- B. Witnesses "Mary Magdalene and the other Mary" (1b)
- C. Winning "an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and approached the tomb. He rolled back the stone and was sitting on it." (2b) So significant are the implications of Christ conquering death, that Paul recorded seven implications of the resurrection in I Corinthians 15:12-19:
  - 1. The Resurrection is necessary for Christ to be alive. (vs. 13, 16)
  - 2. The Resurrection gives meaning to **Christianity**. (vs. 14)
  - 3. The Resurrection gives meaning and worth to our faith. (vss. 14, 17)
  - 4. The Resurrection makes Christianity **true**. (vs. 15)
  - 5. The Resurrection delivers us from **sin**. (vs. 17)
  - 6. The Resurrection proves life after death. (vs. 18)
  - 7. The Resurrection provides the difference between **hope** and **despair**. (vs. 19)

## II. Christ's Resurrection Confirms His Power

- "...because I know you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. <sup>6</sup> He is not here! For He has been resurrected, just as He said. Come and see the place where He lay. <sup>7</sup> Then go quickly and tell His disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead."
- **A.** The Roman governor, Pilate, sentenced Jesus to die by crucifixion; such a sentence meant death. (27:23-24)

- **B.** A crowd of witnesses watched Him die (27:39-44).
- **C.** A professional squad of Roman executioners certified His death to the governor.
- **D.** Joseph of Arimathea asked for His body and prepared it for burial with about 75 pounds of spices and burial shrouds (John 19:38-42).
- III. Christ's Resurrection Commands Us to Proclaim "...go quickly and tell..." (7)
- IV. Christ Resurrection Comforts Us with His Presence "...He is going ahead of you into Galilee; you will see Him there..." (7) For every Go, there's a Lo, I will be with you. (Mt. 28:19-20)
- V. Christ's Resurrection Creates Personal Joy "...and great joy" (8)
- VI. Christ's Resurrection Calls for Recognition

  "Just then Jesus met them and said, "Good morning!" They came up, took hold of His feet,
  and worshiped Him." (9)
  - **A.** Mary recognized His voice. (9-10)
  - **B.** Thomas recognized His scars. (John 20:28; Luke 24:50)
  - **C.** The Disciples on the road to Emmaus recognized Him when He broke bread. (Luke 24:30-31)
  - **D.** Peter recognized Him when He performed a miracle. (John 21:6-7)
