Covenant is the most solemn and binding form of divine promise, and assurance to man of divine commitment, and a reminder given by God of His faithfulness. God makes the covenant, fixes its terms and conditions, and remains everlastingly faithful. (Believers Study Bible p. 20-21)

BIBLICAL COVENANTS

The Covenant with Adam

Genesis 1:28; 2:15-16; 3:15-19

- a. Before the Fall, he could remain in Eden as long as he obeyed. This was conditional.
- b. After the Fall, God would someday send a Savior. This was unconditional.

The Covenant with Noah

Genesis 8:21-22

The earth would not be destroyed by water again and the seasons would continue until the end. This was unconditional.

• The Covenant with Abraham

Genesis 12:2-3, 7; 13:14-17; 15:5, 18; 17:8

God would make Abraham the founder of a great nation and someday give Palestine to Abraham's seed forever. This was unconditional.

The Covenant with Moses and Israel

Exodus 19:3-8; Leviticus 26; Deuteronomy 28

Israel could have the land to enjoy if they obeyed or would forfeit all God's blessings if they disobeyed. This was conditional.

The Covenant with David

2 Chronicles 13:5; 2 Samuel 7:12-16; 23:5

An everlasting throne, kingdom and king would come from David. This was unconditional.

• The Covenant with the Church (New Covenant)

Matthew 16:18; 26:28; Luke 22:20; Hebrews 13:20-21

- a. Christ would build his Church with his own blood.
- b. All the fury of hell would not destroy it.
- c. He would perfect all the members of his Church. This was unconditional.

• The Covenant with Israel

Jeremiah 31:31-34; Isaiah 42:6; 43:1-6; Deuteronomy 1:1-9; Hebrews 8:7-12

- a. God would eventually bring Israel back to himself.
- b. He would forgive their iniquity and forget their sin.
- c. He would use them to reach and teach Gentiles.
- d. He would establish them in Palestine forever. This was unconditional.
