

LEARNING THE LINGO:

HOUSTON'S FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH IS AN EVANGELICAL, CONSERVATIVE, AND BAPTIST CHURCH.

CONSERVATIVE

The belief that the Bible is God's true, inerrant, inspired, and revelatory word for man to follow.

EVANGELICAL

Believers that embrace the core beliefs revealed in the Scriptures regarding saving faith and sharing the gospel.

PRIESTHOOD of the Believer

Laypersons have the same right as ordained ministers to communicate with God, interpret Scripture, and minister in Christ's name. This in no way contradicts the biblical role, responsibility and authority of pastoral leadership and the layperson's response to it.

ACCOUNTABLE

Each person is accountable before God. Your family or church cannot save you. Individuals must decide for themselves whether or not to accept Jesus Christ as their Savior and live accordingly.

AUTONOMOUS

Our church is free to determine its membership and direction under the headship of Jesus Christ. We may partner with other associations, churches, conventions, and ministries as the Lord leads.

Summary of Basic Beliefs

The doctrinal statement of our faith and practice is called *The Baptist Faith & Message*. The following is only a brief, partial summary, but a full text is available online at HoustonsFirst.org.

The Scriptures

The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is God's revelation of Himself to man. It is a perfect treasure of divine instruction. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of error, for its matter.

God

There is one and only one living and true God...The eternal God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, with distinct personal attributes, but without division of nature, essence, or being.

God the Father

God as Father reigns with providential care over His universe, His creatures and the flow of the stream of human history according to the purposes of His grace...God is Father in truth to those who become children of God through faith in Jesus Christ.

God the Son

Christ is the eternal Son of God. In His incarnation as Jesus Christ, He was conceived of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary...He honored the divine law by His personal obedience, and in His death on the cross, He made provision for the redemption of men from sin.

God the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the Spirit of God...He exalts Christ. He convicts of sin, of righteousness and of judgment...He enlightens and empowers the believer and the church in worship, evangelism, and service.

Man

Man was created by the special act of God, in His own image, and is the crowning work of His creation. By his free choice man sinned against God and brought sin into the human race. The sacredness of human personality is evident in that God created man in His own image, and in that Christ died for man; therefore, every man possesses dignity and is worthy of respect and Christian love.

Salvation

Salvation involves the redemption of the whole man, and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, who by His own blood obtained eternal redemption for the believer. In its broadest sense salvation includes regeneration, sanctification, and glorification.

God's Purpose of Grace

Election is the gracious purpose of God, according to which He regenerates, sanctifies, and glorifies sinners. All true believers endure to the end. Those whom God has accepted in Christ and sanctified by His Spirit will never fall away from the state of grace, but shall persevere to the end.

The Church

A New Testament church of the Lord Jesus Christ is a local body of baptized believers who are associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the Gospel and seek to extend the Gospel to the ends of the earth. This church is an autonomous body. The New Testament speaks also of the church as the body of Christ, which includes all of the redeemed of all the ages.

Baptism & The Lord's Supper

Christian baptism is the immersion of a believer in water. It is an act of obedience symbolizing the believer's faith in a crucified, buried, and risen Savior. The Lord's Supper is a symbolic act of obedience whereby members of the church, through partaking of the bread and the fruit of the vine, memorialize the death of the Redeemer and anticipate His second coming.

The Lord's Day

The first day of the week is the Lord's Day. It commemorates the resurrection of Christ from the dead and should be employed in exercises of worship and spiritual devotion.

Last Things

God, in His own time and in His own way, will bring the world to its appropriate end. Jesus Christ will return personally and visibly. The dead will be raised and Christ will judge all men in righteousness. The unrighteous will be consigned to Hell. The righteous will receive their reward and will dwell forever in Heaven with the Lord.

Evangelism & Missions

It is the duty and privilege of every follower of Christ and every church of the Lord Jesus Christ to endeavor to make disciples of all nations and to seek constantly to win the lost to Christ by personally sharing their faith.

Education

The cause of education in the Kingdom of Christ is co-ordinate with the causes of missions and general benevolence...There should be a proper balance between academic freedom and academic responsibility...The freedom of a teacher in a Christian school, college or seminary is limited by the pre-eminence of Jesus Christ, by the authoritative nature of the Scriptures, and by the distinct purpose for which the school exists.

Stewardship

God is the source of all blessings, temporal and spiritual; all that we have and are belongs to Him. Christians have a spiritual debt to the whole world, a holy trust in the gospel, and a binding stewardship in their possessions. They therefore have the privilege and calling to serve Him with their time, talents and material possessions.

Cooperation

Christ's people should...organize such associations and conventions as may best secure cooperation for the great objects of the Kingdom of God. Such organizations have no authority over one another or over the churches... Cooperation is desirable between the various Christian denominations.

The Christian Social Order

Every Christian is under obligation to seek to make the will of Christ supreme in his own life and in human society...The Christian should oppose in the spirit of Christ every form of greed, selfishness, and vice.

Religious Liberty

Church and state should be separate. The state owes to every church protection and full freedom in the pursuit of its spiritual ends...A free church in a free state is the Christian ideal.

Family

God has ordained the family as the foundational institution of human society...Marriage is the unity of one man and one woman in covenant commitment for a lifetime...The husband and wife are of equal worth before God, since both are created in God's image. The marriage relationship models the way God relates to His people...Children, from the moment of conception, are a blessing and heritage from the Lord.

Southern Baptist Convention

The term "Southern Baptist Convention" refers to both the denomination and its annual meeting. Working through 1,200 local associations and 41 state conventions and fellowships, Southern Baptists share a common bond of basic biblical beliefs (*The Baptist Faith & Message*) and a commitment to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the entire world.

GATHER / GROW / GIVE

A healthy church member (and an impactful Difference Maker) will grow as a disciple of Jesus Christ in the areas of **Gathering**, **Growing**, and **Giving**. Our expectation is that each member will **Gather** for one hour per week, **Grow** for one hour per week. A healthy member of Houston's First will participate in all three areas.

GATHER () OUR HEARTS

Houston's First gathers for Worship each Sunday at campuses across our city. At each campus, you'll experience worship through music and the teaching of God's Word (the Bible) by Pastor Gregg in person or via a live video link, or a live message from your local campus staff.

GROW (2) OUR SOULS

The purpose of the Grow Strategy is to help people deepen their walk with Christ, be transformed to His likeness, surrendered further to His Lordship, thirst for His Word, and love Him more deeply. Life Bible Studies are offered weekly, and Milestones Courses are offered throughout the year on various days of the week.

GIVE S OUR LIVES

At Houston's First, we give our lives through missions, volunteering, evangelism, prayer, and financial contributions.



GATHERING OUR HEARTS

Houston's First gathers for worship each Sunday at campuses around Houston. No matter which campus you attend, you'll find powerful worship music, teaching by Pastor Gregg Matte, and Life Bible Studies where you can connect with others as you study God's Word further.

THE LOOP

After more than 130 years of ministry in Downtown Houston, our church moved to our location on the Katy Freeway in 1977 on what was still considered by some to be the "outskirts" of town. The 610 Loop and Galleria were just a few years old at the time, but quickly grew into a thriving center of commerce and activity.

Over the past few decades, Houston's First has ministered to our city from this busy corner at I-10 and the 610 Loop and has grown along the way with the addition of the Fitness & Recreation Center, First Baptist Academy, the south tower, an expanded Counseling Center, the Preschool & Children's building, and the water wall and cross tower.

The Loop Campus is more than just a campus for our church. With its central location in the city and state-of-the-art features, the campus has become a frequent venue for outside events as well, such as concerts, conferences, and other special gatherings.



CYPRESS

The northwest region of the greater Houston area is growing at a rapid pace with more and more homes being built every year. Houston's First recognized this trend and wanted to be a part of the community where so many new people were moving and where many of our members already lived. So, the church launched our Cypress Campus in 2013.

We met at Smith Middle School every Sunday for four years and had separate rented space that served as a Ministry Center for offices and weekday programs. Despite not having a permanent place of our own, we went on annual mission trips, partnerships were formed with local ministries, and our church family stepped up to serve the community in a variety of ways.



Then, thanks to the generosity of the Houston's First family, we moved in to a new facility in 2017 next door to a Cy-Fair ISD educational village—including Bridgeland High School. Just like during our time at Smith Middle School, worship services on Sundays feature a live band and a video link with Pastor Gregg Matte's message live from The Loop Campus. In addition, Life Bible Studies are offered for all ages—birth through adults.

DOWNTOWN

Downtown has come a long way since Houston's First was founded in 1841. It has even changed since the church moved from Downtown to The Loop Campus in 1977. Sports and arts venues, residential and retail establishments, transportation and infrastructure improvements—the list goes on and on. But one thing hasn't changed: the need for the Good News of Jesus Christ.

On October 2, 2011, Houston's First went back to the heart of our city in the tunnel level of 1010 Lamar, the office tower on the block where we ministered to our city for generations. The Downtown Campus began meeting at the tunnel level of 1010 Lamar, the office tower on the block where we ministered to the city for generations and the location of HighPoint Bible Study. In late 2016, The Lord provided an office building at 1730 Jefferson Street, where the Downtown Campus would move in March of 2017. Just two blocks south of the Toyota Center, the campus positions us to minister to the thousands of residents who live Downtown and along the current and future METRO Rail lines.

The Downtown Campus is a diverse community with a high-energy passion for reaching the heart of the city. Worship Services feature a live band, video messages by Pastor Gregg or local messages by campus staff, and live testimonies. Kids' Worship is available for children (K-2nd Grade) at 11a on Level 3. Children (3rd Grade and older) join their family for worship with the rest of the church at 11a in the Worship Center. Life Bible Study groups are available for birth-12th grade, college-aged students, and adults.





SIENNA

Houston's First desires to reach all of Houston with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The Great Commission (Matthew 28:18–20) is our mission. In order to accomplish this mission, in 2011 the decision was made to multiply the church's presence throughout the city by establishing campuses across the Houston area.

Through prayerful consideration, the leadership of Houston's First recognized the southwest side of Houston had experienced unprecedented growth in the last decade, creating a crucial need for an expanded faithful Gospel witness and ministry in the area. With this in mind, Houston's First approached Grace Church about the possibility of a partnership. After much prayer, the two churches came together on Easter Sunday 2013 to plant the Sienna Campus of Houston's First in Fort Bend County, a rapidly growing and ethnically diverse county. As a result, people from nations all over the world, worship Jesus together at Houston's First – Sienna.

Since 2013, our Sienna Campus has experienced the same continued rapid growth that the community has. And today, our campus features three services each with live, dynamic, and engaging worship. In the 8:30a service we are led in worship by a full band and live preaching by our Campus Pastor Malcolm Marshall. The same passionate worship team leads us in the 9:45a and 11:15a services as well with our Senior Pastor Gregg Matte preaching via a live link. Children's Ministry (birth–5th grade) is provided in all three services, with our middle schoolers meeting at 9:45a and our high schoolers at 11:15a.

We're excited to announce that as a result of our *Kainos* initiative, our Sienna Campus will begin construction in early 2023 on an all new, state of the art 53,000 square foot worship center facility with modern and expanded NextGen ministry space.

THE SYMBOLISM OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

Jesus never asked His disciples to remember His birth; however, He did instruct them to remember His death and resurrection. He gave the church two visible symbols (called "ordinances") as reminders of His death. The Lord's Supper is an object lesson that represents a great spiritual truth for believers.

WHAT IS THE LORD'S SUPPER? 1 CORINTHIANS 11:23-26

- 1. It is a simple act. "The Lord Jesus, on the night He was betrayed, took bread..." vs. 23
- 2. It is **A REMEMBRANCE**. "...and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, 'This is my body, which is for you; eat it in remembrance of Me.'" vs. 24
- 3. It is A REMINDER OF CHRIST'S DEATH." In the same way, He took the cup, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood; drink it to remember Me.'" vs. 25
- 4. It is a statement of faith. "For whenever you eat the bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until He comes back." vs. 26

WHO SHOULD TAKE THE LORD'S SUPPER?

- 1. Only those who are already believers. "For anyone who eats and drinks without recognizing the body of the Lord eats and drinks judgment upon himself." 1 Corinthians 11:29
- 2. Children who have accepted Christ and understand the ceremony (parental determination) are allowed and encouraged to participate.
- 3. "Therefore, whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be guilty of sinning against the body and blood of the Lord. A person ought to examine himself before he eats of the bread and drinks of the cup." 1 Corinthians 11:27–28

Worthy manner = not taking it lightly or irreverently

WHEN & HOW OFTEN DOES OUR CHURCH OBSERVE THE LORD'S SUPPER?

Generally, we partake of the Lord's Supper at Houston's First Baptist Church quarterly in our worship services. Jesus never said when or how often believers should observe the Lord's Supper. A benevolent or designated non-profit offering is taken after each Lord's Supper.

SECTION 5

WHAT THE BIBLE TEACHES ABOUT TITHING?

"Tithe" means a 10th part.

WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN A TITHE AND AN OFFERING?

A "tithe" is giving **a tenth** of my income.

An "offering" is anything I give **IN ADDITION** to my tithe.

A tithe in the Old Testament was **<u>REQUIRED</u>** by God, while offerings were freewill.



There is more to generosity than financial transactions. In God's eyes, our growth in generosity is less about a financial transaction and more about a transformation. Generosity is a matter of the heart! As a form of worship, receiving tithes and offerings is a part of each of our worship services. No matter where you are on your generosity journey, we encourage you to discover the blessings that come when you give back to the Lord.

- 7. Tithing gives God a chance to prove He exists and wants to bless you! "Bring your whole tithes to My storehouse. Test me in this says the Lord, and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that you won't have room enough for it! I will prevent pests from devouring your crops and the vines in your fields will be protected from plagues." Malachi 3:8–10
- 8. Obedience in tithing is a proof that I really love God. Jesus said, "If you really love me, do what I command." John 14:15

GROWING OUR SOULS PURPOSE STATEMENT

The purpose of the **Grow Strategy** is to help people deepen their walk with Christ, be transformed to His likeness, surrender further to His Lordship, thirst for His Word, and love Him more deeply. The primary tools of the Grow Strategy are Life Bible Study and Milestones.



Life Bible Study is a weekly, small group **Gathering** of the church, welcoming believers and seekers alike to experience **Growing** faith in Christ. Studying God's Word creates Christians who are committed to **Giving** away their lives by loving and serving those who need it most.



Milestones is a framework of adult discipleship that extends beyond Life Bible Studies to equip people in a particular stage of life, special situation, or in general discipleship. This is accomplished through semester-long courses, one-time classes, and special events.

Our Faith Centers in the Spring Branch and Harwin areas have Food Pantry & Clothes Closet ministries serving their communities. The Spring Branch location is just down the street from the Faith Center campus (8009 Long Point Rd.), and the Harwin location is housed along with that Faith Center. It takes 100 volunteers per week to run these two ministries! There are additional opportunities to serve with English as a Second Language (ESL), Kids' Club, after school tutoring and more.

BAPTISM

WHO HAS THE AUTHORITY TO BAPTIZE?

- Someone under proper authority has proper authority.
- Three documented groups of people who performed baptisms in the New Testament:
 - o The Apostles Paul and others
 - o Deacons Philip baptized the Ethiopian eunuch in Acts 8
 - o Laymen Ananias baptized Paul in Acts 9

Baptisms will be accepted by Houston's First Baptist Church if the person was baptized after salvation, by immersion under water as a symbolic testimony of their new life in Christ, and if it was administered under the proper authority of a church, ministry or mission effort of like faith and order in regard to biblical doctrine as stated in *The Baptist Faith & Message*.

FAQS ABOUT BAPTISM BY IMMERSION

WHO IS A CANDIDATE FOR BAPTISM?

Is it babies or **believers**?

- Those who have placed their trust in Jesus Christ alone for the forgiveness of their sins are candidates for baptism.
- Those that accepted His message. (Acts 2:41) This is referred to as believer's baptism.

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF BAPTISM?

Is it for salvation or symbolism?

"What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? By no means! We died to sin; how can we live in it any longer? Or don't you know that all of us who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were therefore buried with him through baptism into death in order that, just as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, we too may live a new life." Romans 6:1–4

Baptism shows a beautiful picture of the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus. The purpose is to symbolically profess new life through salvation in Jesus Christ.

WHAT IS THE METHOD OF BAPTISM?

Greek word baptizo means to immerse under water.

- It is biblical to immerse; there are other Greek words for pour and sprinkle, but they are never used in the New Testament for baptism.
- Baptism defined in that time period:
 - o Plato to immerse in wine (427-347 BC)
 - o Josephus to sink a ship (37-100 AD)
 - o Plutarch to be over your head and ears in debt (45-125 AD)

CHURCH HISTORY & AFFILIATIONS

Houston's First Baptist Church was organized in 1841 by 16 men and women, just five years after the Battle of the Alamo and before Texas became a state. Our church family has been ministering to the people of Houston—and beyond—ever since. The church has survived through wars, yellow fever epidemics, and the 1900 Galveston Hurricane, which destroyed one of our early church buildings. Members of our church helped pioneer Baylor University, the Star of Hope Mission and the Baptist (Memorial) Hospital System and School of Nursing.

In 1970, Houston's First called John Bisagno as pastor. The church experienced phenomenal growth, and in 1977 moved to The Loop Campus at the Katy Freeway. Bro. John retired in 2000, and on Easter Sunday, April 11, 2004, Gregg Matte was called as our 35th pastor. Under Pastor Gregg's leadership, the church is growing with a thriving Life Bible Study ministry, campuses around Houston, and numerous local, national, and international missional endeavors.

At Houston's First Baptist Church we take seriously the responsibility to create environments of safety and security, protecting the wellbeing of children, youth, and special needs adults (CYSNA). These policies and procedures have been developed to prevent intentional and unintentional harm happening to children, youth, and special needs adults as they participate in programs, services, and activities across all campuses and auxiliary ministries. These policies are also intended to assist our staff and unpaid volunteers as they serve the church.

We will SAY SOMETHING if we SEE SOMETHING.

If you observe any behavior (child, parent, volunteer, or staff) that seems "off" or suspicious, report this to your supervisor or a staff member right away.

2 We will watch for and report "grooming" behavior.

Anything that creates secrecy, privacy, or isolates a child from the group by an adult should be reported.

8 We will maintain the Two-Adult Rule.

Two adults must be present in the room or area of ministry and one-on-one interactions should be interruptible and visible.

We will ensure private activities are only performed by approved persons and do not violate the Two-Adult Rule.

This includes activities such as diapering, toileting, dressing, and bathing.

5 We will teach and model healthy touch.

We will not engage in spanking, hitting, or threatening any child, nor any behavior or touching which is inappropriate with a child including sexualized behavior such as kissing and fondling. We will respect a child's ability to say NO.

THE CODE OF CONDUCT FOR APPROPRIATE INTERACTION WITH KIDS

6 We will exercise due diligence in avoiding risky behavior in "hotspots."

Hotspots include transportation, bathrooms, closets, camp lodging, or secluded areas.

We will communicate with everyone in a safe, respectful, and encouraging manner.

We will not bully, give false promises, engage in sexualized talk, "pet names," shouting, shaming, or silencing of any child, volunteer, staff member, or parent. This also includes the addition of a second adult in all electronic communication with students.

8 We will affirm each person's inherent dignity as someone made in the image of God.

We will report any behavior by children that is not age-appropriate in an effort to provide restoration and healing.

We will provide professional communication with parents/ guardians and not insult or criticize parenting techniques.

Any practices deemed dangerous to a child will be reported to a supervisor.

- We will be aware of the potential for peer abuse in any form and seek to provide supervision and intercession that will minimize this risk.
- Every approved Safeguarding volunteer will be clearly identified as a Houston's First volunteer.






