You know Houston's First has three campuses other than the one at The Loop — but do you know why? Our Multisite Signature explains what we believe about this approach to expanding His kingdom in the greater Houston area.

# WHAT IT IS AND WHAT IT IS NOT

In Multisite Churches: Guidance for the Movement's Next Generation, Scott McConnell makes two statements that articulate what multisite is and what it is not:

- "By definition, multisite involves starting a site somewhere other than your current campus."
- "The multisite strategy does not replace any other method of participating in kingdom growth. It does not replace church planting, personal evangelism, visitation programs, investing and inviting, servant evangelism, or evangelistic training."

# WHAT WE BELIEVE ABOUT MULTISITE

# We believe in HIS TIMING

- **Growing City.** The Houston area has grown 26% in the past 10 years and is expected to grow another 34% in the next 10 years.
- Growing Church. Attendance is at an all time high in worship services and Life Bible Studies. Parking at 7401 Katy Freeway (the Loop Campus) is at capacity.
- **New Technology.** With video streaming web technology, we can "transport" the message easier and at a lower cost.
- Recent Experiences. Use of the Gym and Fellowship Center during the Worship Center renovation, our Downtown Campus, and other experiences have prepared us for multisites.

## We believe in HIS MISSION

- Consistent with Our Historical Mission. Multisite is Great Commission and Acts 1:8 work. The church (assembled community of believers: ekklesia) is the vehicle God uses to reach
- Consistent with Our Local Strategy. Houston's First has a rich history of encouraging and revitalizing neighborhood congregations. Since the 1980s, we have worked with more than 75 local congregations all over the city.

# We believe it EXTENDS HIS MINISTRY

- Missions-Centered Endeavor. The multisite model extends the ministry of our church rather than expanding our brand. Across the nation, the multisite strategy has experienced an 80% success rate as compared to a 30% success rate for traditional church plants.
- Community and Quality. The multisite model brings together the best aspects of large churches and small churches. You experience a small-community feel, but with the same quality level you find at larger churches during the worship times, Life Bible Studies and other exported ministries.

### New Contexts

TO NEIGHBORHOODS. It extends our ministry to neighborhoods where current members live. It assists in reaching friends and family unwilling to travel a great distance to church.

TO AFFINITY GROUPS. It increases options for meeting locations, meeting times, and worship format. This enables a church to extend itself into niches like an office complex or a YMCA. The church can also focus more intently on neighborhood ministry needs and affinity groups such as a cancer center or assisted living facility.

**Emerging Leadership.** The multisite model expands leadership opportunities for the congregation. Each time a new site is opened, leaders and volunteers emerge at the new site and at the sending campus as well.

# We believe it is an EFFECTIVE MODEL

- Preserves Our Core DNA. The multisite model preserves our church's congregational structure and governance, while retaining our signature statements in mission (Great Commission and Acts 1:8), vision (Relevant, Biblical, Community), strategy (Gather, Grow, Give), and beliefs (Baptist Faith & Message).
- Empowers The Campus Pastor. A healthy model uses video teaching as a resource for the on-campus pastor, freeing him to be involved in the lives and needs of the neighborhood. It establishes him as the clear local leader of his staff and
- Good Stewardship. The multisite model can provide a lower cost of operation since support services can be shared across campuses. Worship, Creative, Communications, Production, HR, Security, Facilities and Operations can all be tooled to support multiple campuses.



## Looking at Mike and Brandi Cabiro's story, you can see an example of how God weaves our stories together and prepares us for what's ahead long before we know what's coming.

Mike came to Houston's First in the mid-1990s as a young single adult from Louisiana. Almost a decade later, he met and married Brandi and they continued to serve in various capacities at The Loop Campus. In 2008, Mike was ordained as a Deacon.

But in January 2012, the Cabiros left Houston's First along with their young children, Avery and Luke.

"We felt God calling us to make deeper relationships in the neighborhood where we lived — Sienna," Mike recalls. "Although we had a great community of fellow believers at Houston's First, they were in other parts of town and we were not plugging into our own community where we lived."

Once they left, Mike and Brandi searched many local churches for 6 months until they felt God calling them to serve at Grace Church. You can imagine their surprise when talks of a merger between Houston's First and Grace began, and their new church became the Sienna Campus of their former church in March 2013 — right around the time their third child, Cole, was born.

"When the merger happened," Brandi says, "we were very excited to partner once again

with a church that has such vision and a heart for reaching out to those who don't know Christ or who don't have a relevant biblical community of their own."

For Mike and Brandi, serving at the Sienna Campus has challenged them to step outside of their comfort zones as they reach out to their neighbors.

Mike shares that "it has deepened our prayer life to help start something new and reach people who are not familiar with the importance of Christ in their lives and the relevance of a church community."

Brandi adds, "In a very real sense, it has been like serving on the mission field."


