Sight-Seeing Trip Different

A group of women from Houston's First travelled to NYC and exchanged sight-seeing for a look at the city through God's eyes. Michelle Reynolds shares about their trip.

On September 12, 22 women — mostly from the As One Life Bible Study at The Loop — embarked on a three-day journey to New York City with the expressed purpose to pray. We were going to pray for the people of New York City — for both the lost and the believers, for the congregants of First Baptist Church of New York, and for their pastor and his wife, Matthew and Kimberly Hoskinson.

Some of these women I knew and some I had never met before, yet before landing back in Houston, we all had gone from polite

conversation to approaching His throne of grace together with boldness so that we would receive mercy and find grace to help us.

We started our mornings off with a brisk New York-paced walk to have a time for prayer, worship, a devotional and a look at the agenda for the day. Then, we would continue to FBCNY where we met with Pastor Matthew and Kimberly.

We were welcomed with warm hearts and open arms as they shared the difficulties they have encountered, including cancer, as they pursued the Lord and moved their family from a small southern town to Gotham. Their small chapel became holy ground as we surrounded this couple and prayed the Holy Spirit would

bring great strength and courage while knov Jesus delights in them and their obedience.

We then took that Spirit of prayer and worship through the halls and pews of that church in a time of consecration and then out to the streets of New York. We went out in all directions, in groups, humbly speaking aloud and calling on the Lord to cause His children to awaken from their spiritual apathy and asking forgiveness for a people who know not what they are doing.



Reaching The Forgotten Borough

Staten Island is one of the five boroughs of New York City. It is also the southernmost point of New York State and is often coined as "the forgotten borough." Whereas much attention is focused on the other boroughs, people often don't think of Staten Island. My heart is burdened for the ½ million people who live there and the fact that 86% are considered unchurched.

More than anything, I was challenged by my situation and the fact that it wasn't until I was 20 years old that someone had decided to invite me to discover what it meant to have a relationship with Jesus Christ.
