Meet The \Leftrightarrow J-People \Leftrightarrow

Nearly 8,000 miles away in East Asia is a group of people most of our church family will never meet. Few of us will ever walk among them, hear their language, or experience their culture. Despite the many obstacles between us, we want you to get to know them. They are a part of Houston's First.

We call them the J-People. For security reasons, we cannot put their full name or location in print or on the church's website. And, we cannot share with you the names of the team members working with the J-People right there in their own community. That's the reality of sharing the Good News in a difficult place.

The majority of the roughly 300,000 J-People are farmers, working with livestock and various crops. Some J-People who live closer to cities are merchants or shop owners. They tend to be Tibetan Buddhists or followers of polytheistic practices.

Missionary work in the early 1900s was halted when civil war broke out in their home nation. Ongoing political hostilities and a remote location make reaching the J-People a particular challenge. The home nation's government does not recognize the J-People as minorities; therefore, they have no access to resources offered to official minority groups.

Currently, there are no Bible translations, radio broadcasts, JESUS films or Gospel recordings in the language of the J-People. This is due to their language not being a written language — it is only spoken — and a lack of manpower to take on these significant projects.

TAKING THE GOSPEL Introducing the love of Christ to an Unreached People Group

What is a people group?

A people group is an ethnolinguistic group with a common self-identity shared by the various members. Ethno refers to common history, values, practices, culture, and patterns of life. *Linguistic* refers to the common language.

What does unreached mean?

A people group is considered unreached when less than 2% of their population is evangelical. To be more specific, the best reports put the number of believers among the J-People at 20-30 people — about .01% of their population of 300,000. If that percentage were applied to Harris County, only 410 of our 4,100,000 neighbors would be believers — at most.

What does it mean to adopt them?

Houston's First is committed to seeing the J-People transformed by the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the point where they are self-sufficient and self-reproducing — no longer in need of our support and planting churches on their own. That is not accomplished quickly. Our commitment is to the J-People themselves, so we will partner with the missionaries working with them as the years go by until the goal is reached.

What is happening there now?

Team leaders are working on orally translating ten Old Testament stories. Once translated, the stories will be recorded and given to locals. As of now, they have three stories translated and recorded! They are praying for manpower and financial support to complete the project.

We are thankful for Houston's First's partnership with our team in our efforts to reach those who have never heard the good news of Christ. Because of your giving, we have been able to set up a sound studio in our city to record Gospel stories. Your giving is getting the Word to people who have never heard it in their own language.


