FOOD PANTRY & CLOTHES CLOSET

One of the most utilized ministries of the Faith Center is located just down the street at 8244 Long Point Drive. Each month, the ministry provides food to an average of 665 families (2,008 individuals), and clothes and household items to an average of 525 families (1,305 individuals). Shoppers take home much-needed goods, and they also hear the Good News and see Christ's love lived out by our team of volunteers – people just like you!

KAREN BAPTIST CHURCH

The Karen people are among the Burmese refugees ing in the greater Houston area. From babies to senior adults, approximately 200 Karen gather at Timbergrove on Sunday mornings for Sunday school at 9:30a and worship at 11a. Led by Pastor Meh, a refugee himself, these believers mostly live south of NRG Park on the 610 Loop and commute to Timbergrove each Sunday.

to our city. Located off Harwin near the Westpark church." Tollway and the Sam Houston Parkway, the apartment complex is home to several refugee communities including Burmese, Nepalese, and Bhutanese. Life Bible Study members from Houston's First have continued the ministry beyond Houston 1:8 week by hosting kids' clubs every other Saturday.

As an outgrowth of these relationships with the residents, the Faith Center has plans to rent space in the area to enable expanded and ongoing ministry JP and Megan Johnson, the Houston 1:8 ministry site leaders for SunBlossom, are looking forward to the possibilities.

"Our prayer for the Faith Center - Harwin is to provide ELS classes, citizenship classes, after-school tutoring, kids' clubs, a clothes closet and food pantry, a counseling/crisis center, computer classes, and an art business class to empower women through microenterprise," says Megan, who also serves on the church's Missions Council.
