

SERVE (SERVING THE WIDOWS OF OUR CHURCH FAMILY

No matter who you ask, Men: Serve is a "God thing" in terms of how it started and its impact on those involved. You could say its roots go back to the early '90s when Bill Neighbors heard Bro. John Bisagno read a Bible verse one

Sunday about taking care of the widows. "The sermon wasn't about widows, but that verse was all I heard," says Bill. "I knew this was something I had to do."

Since then, Bill has used his skills as a contractor to meet the needs of widows in our church. That explains Bill's answer when Minister to Men Eric Reed asked Bill in late 2011 what he would like to see the Men's Ministry do. Bill quickly replied, "Serve the widows."

His answer struck a chord with Eric. Eric's maternal grandmother was widowed twice, and he recalls as a young boy seeing her struggle with basic things. "Her church really didn't do much at all," Eric recalls. "My father would often vent that the local church should do more in an organized way to meet the needs of widows like my grandmother."

Jairo's schedule as a military reservist limited his involvement after the first Men: Serve. However, God provided another man to help. Over breakfast following the second Men: Serve in June 2012, Greg Bowden asked Eric if there were any help he needed. "Do you like spreadsheets?" Eric asked. As a director of finance, Greg knew his way around a spreadsheet and stepped in to help organize the Men: Serve effort in September of that year. Greg led Men: Serve beginning in November 2012 and continues to serve as the coordinator to this day.





COMMUNITY IMPACT

Men: Serve's impact extends far beyond the volunteers and the widows. Yard signs placed in front of the widows' homes have inspired countless conversations with neighbors and passersby. "Your church does that for you?" is a common question widows are asked, giving them an opportunity to share about their faith and what it means to be a part of a community of believers. On service days, Men: Serve organizers stop

by a certain Starbucks to get coffee for the volunteers as they assemble at the church. One Saturday, a barista wrote James 1:27 on the carton along with a message to "Be Bold."



KIDS SERVE, TOO

Many men involved with Men: Serve see it as an opportunity to teach their children a valuable lesson. "Witt and Charlie love coming to Men: Serve," says Rob Grooms, an accountant, about his two sons. "A lot of what we do as Christians today can seem complicated to 11 and 7 year olds — but that is not the case with Men: Serve. We meet at church and go serve the widows. Hard to get much more simple than that."

Even in a large church, Rob says he and his sons have been able to help a familiar face — a woman who had taken care of Witt and Charlie when they were infants. "Our first time to serve, we were assigned to Mae Bell — a woman who has served in the church nursery for over 50 years," Rob recalls. "She had held in her arms and changed the diapers of the same two boys who were now serving her. I can't think of anyone more fitting to help her than two of the thousands of children she had cared for."

MINISTRY COLLABORATION

Before men arrive at a widows' home, work has already taken place. Our Pastoral Care Ministry maintains relationships with the widows, tracks their needs, and purchases necessary supplies. A week before the service day, Peggy Jones and Sherry Oradat from Pastoral Care sit down with Men: Serve leaders to form teams based on the widows' needs and the skills and experience of the registered volunteers.

The Faith Center is providing room at their Timbergrove location to create a teaching workshop for skilled men to teach other men how to make common repairs. Not only will it increase the capacity of our Men: Serve volunteers, but it will also provide opportunities for men of all ages to disciple
