FROM BREAK IN TO BREAKTHROUGH

Cody Christian, a young single adult in the Renewed Life Bible Study at The Loop Campus, shares how an unfortunate event was a turning point in his generosity during MISSION 1:8.

I was hesitant to be obedient to God when it came to tithing. I gave regularly what I thought was a decent amount to my previous church, but not a tithe. MISSION 1:8 started about a month after I started going to Houston's First and I began thinking it was time for me to get closer to tithing.

Pastor Gregg's illustration of a ladder with each rung representing a level of giving spoke to my heart. I was pondering/praying/studying on the subject after church one Sunday, trying to understand what exactly God expected of me.

Then, I woke up the next day and found that my truck had been broken into.


The wretched thieves had broken the window out and stolen my radio, tools, and rifle! Due to the timing of the break in, I took it as a message from God: "I can either give you more of what I have given you, or I can take away what you have. It all comes from Me. Keep your trust in Me and do not fear or worry. Love Me, not money."

With this new perspective, I decided that I had to just let go and trust God. I prayed about the amount, and told Him that I was giving in obedience to His word, love for Him and His Kingdom, and with faith in His promises to take care of my needs.

A few months later, I received a promotion with a raise and I have been doing much better financially ever since, never feeling like I'm in a hole the way I used to. He keeps the Devourer away.

Initially, I felt justified and right in "tithing" on my net income, but was soon convinced that with all He has done for me, tithing on my gross income is the least I could do. I've since gone beyond tithing.

The Lord has been faithful to his word, making sure my needs are met, and then He tops it off with extra blessings. The lesson: God is faithful, powerful, and He really likes it when we demonstrate faith in Him — putting your money where your mouth is.

WHERE WE'VE BEEN

In March 2013, Houston's First began a two-year journey that combined two passions of our church — missions and spiritual growth. Called MISSION 1:8, the initiative sought to expand the financial generosity of our church family. In the process — as we each grew in the spiritual discipline of giving — we would support the church's current ministry and multiply our missional endeavors in our city, our nation, and our world, and among the poor, widows, orphans, and prisoners.

The goal was to receive \$60,000,000 over the two years, providing \$45,000,000 for operating expenses and **\$15,000,000 for the new** missional endeavors. Of that additional amount, \$1,500,000 — or 10% — was earmarked for ministries serving the poor, widows, orphans, and prisoners.

BUT GOD DID MORE THAN WE COULD ASK OR IMAGINE!

Thanks to the generosity of the Houston's First family, we are on track to receive \$75,000,000 through the MISSION 1:8 initiative — providing an additional \$15,000,000 for missional endeavors beyond the original \$15,000,000 goal! As a result, we are able to give away \$3,000,000 to the ministries serving these special groups of people.
