

WHEN GOD OPENS DOORS

Ministry only happens where people are present, and when the Cypress Campus of Houston's First was launched in 2013, more than 330 church members from the Cypress area were already commuting to The Loop on Sundays and midweek. Cypress and neighborhoods out west have developed rapidly over the past four years and the completion of the Grand Parkway between I-10 and US 290 has opened the door to a whole new corridor of ministry opportunities on that side of the city.

Today, as Houston's First celebrates the opening of the beautiful new Cypress Campus and as we look ahead to all God will do in this new season, we take a look back at what took place in its original home at Smith Middle School. That is where the foundation of godly community was laid and where God prepared this body of believers for what lies ahead as they enlarge the site of their tent and get ready to welcome others with open doors.

WEEKLY TRANSFORMATION



When God calls a person out of one place of ministry into another, it's difficult to know what to expect. Roy and Natalie Brown were longtime Houston's First members, attending The Loop Campus since 1997, when God led them to be one of the first families to relocate to the Cypress Campus at Smith Middle School on Easter Sunday in 2013. They didn't know their calling would include helping transform a school into a church — every Sunday.

"More than 30 people were part of the Set-Up Team," said Roy. "Some got up at 4:30a or 5a to get there before the team to deliver six trailers full of equipment. I became used to arguing with God and the snooze button about getting up so early. But when Natalie and I were ever forced to miss, I felt all out of sorts."

Transforming a school into a church each week was not easy, but it became a mission of love for the Set-Up Team. Each week's set up included placing wayfinding signs inside and outside; setting up Welcome Team tables in hallways and putting out informative materials; setting up tables, chairs and staging in two gyms to accommodate Life Bible Studies for all ages; and perhaps most challenging, preparing the cafeteria for worship. Preparation for worship included hanging lights and sound equipment, mixing audio, and ensuring the successful presentation of Pastor Gregg's messages.

"Trying to get everything done was nerve wracking in the beginning," said Roy. "But we became a well-oiled machine after a while. Everyone had their particular job to do. It was hard, but fun."

The Set-Up Team wasn't Roy's only responsibility. He works with middle schoolers in The HUB Student Ministry and Natalie works in Heartland with the Preschool Ministry. She's also on the Welcome Team and works with students on Wednesday nights. In

fact, many Set-Up Team members took on additional volunteer responsibilities. The weekly undertaking of completely transforming the school caused the team to grow into an especially close-knit community.

"We really became brothers and sisters on this team," said Roy. "We all got to see God at work before people showed up for church."

Now that the Cypress Campus building is complete, Roy says he will miss the great fun and community they had being part of the Set-Up Team. The assignment may have ended, but he says there will always be ways to plug in, find friendship, and discover a special role in ministry. With the new building located next to Bridgeland High School, he expects the Student Ministry to swell.

"We're so excited, and we anticipate God has big things in store for the future," said Roy. "We're thrilled — and a little scared — about being next to the high school. We're praying God sends a lot of volunteers, and especially those with a heart for students. May we all be willing to do the next thing God has for us to do."

FINDING HIDDEN TREASURE

Only God truly knows the potential for godly excellence hidden inside us all. Special indeed are the people who make it their business to discover and foster those gifts in others. One Cypress Campus member has poured love, time and God's Word into students' lives for decades to develop godly excellence that is changing the world for Christ.



Armed with a degree in Church Music and Youth Ministry from Houston Baptist University, Dennis Perry joined the staff of Wilcrest Baptist Church in southwest Houston full-time in 1977 as minister of music and youth. Already a part-timer there two years, he married his girlfriend, Patricia, and they welcomed their two little girls during his 12 ½-year tenure at Wilcrest Baptist. Dennis has a natural gift for connecting with students; his wisdom, kindness and sense of humor make him easy to talk to and his advice easy to accept.

After more than a decade at Wilcrest Baptist, a student in Dennis' youth group introduced him to a young man who was questioning the wisdom of trusting Christ and what it might mean to his reputation. "He said he was afraid he would turn into a real freak," said Dennis. The young man was Gregg Matte, then a junior at Alief Elsik High School. Gregg went to Dennis' house one night and questioned him for more than two hours

"I finally told Gregg, 'You know you need to be a Christian, and I know you need to be a Christian. Just accept Christ — or go home,'" said Dennis, only half-joking. "Gregg asked Christ into his life that night."

Youth camp at Glorieta Baptist Conference Center the following summer was a pivotal point in Gregg's life. He began his senior year on fire for Christ. "Gregg was living radically for Christ and was well-respected," said Dennis. At one point, Dennis told Gregg he believed God was moving him into ministry. "Gregg told me, 'As long as I don't have to speak in front of anyone,'" recalls Dennis.

Dennis mentored Gregg through high school and into college and beyond. Gregg was a youth intern for three years at Hampton Road Baptist Church in DeSoto, Texas, during Dennis' tenure there as Youth Pastor. "Dennis became a friend, a buddy, to me," said Gregg. "He has always given me wise counsel. His influence changed my life."

Health concerns brought Dennis and Patricia back to the Houston area from Dallas and in 2013 she noticed Houston's First had started another campus not far from their home. The couple visited the Cypress Campus and knew immediately that's where they were supposed to plant their lives. "We wanted to go to a church where we could volunteer and help it grow," said Dennis.

Patricia found her place of ministry in the Preschool Ministry. Dennis plugged in as a greeter and began volunteering with college-age students, an age group he has volunteered with for decades. "I love college students. When we started the class in 2015 there was virtually no one, but last month we had 16 in the class," he said. "It is my biggest joy that God has allowed me to connect with these students for so many vegrs."

Having a former student and someone he has been so close to for many years as his pastor is a blessing to Dennis. "I'm honored to have had the privilege of being part of Pastor Gregg's life," said Dennis. "I respect him so much. He studies God's word and has a passion for all of us to do the same. We look forward to Sundays with a passion; it's the highlight of our week!"
