## welcome to houston's first!



Summer has officially arrived at Houston's First, and in more ways than one! For starters, June is when our NextGen Ministries welcome our 18-and-under members and guests to their new Life Bible Studies for the coming school year. At the same time, our NextGen staff and volunteers are buzzing with plans for camps, VBS, Rush Week, and other activities taking place throughout the summer months.

Summer is also a season for mission trips, with 14 teams from Houston's First headed to 10 nations on five continents between now and the end of August. Our largest mission trip of the year, however, is right here at home—Houston 1:8. The week of July 8—11, missionaries from every campus will serve our neighbors and share the Gospel at dozens of locations throughout the greater Houston area.

Juggling kids and their schedules? Find joy in watching them grow, and pray for lessons to be learned and friends to be made. Working through the summer months? Ask God how you can best reflect Him among your co-workers or clients. Also, consider adding Difference Makers to your summer reading list. The book includes stories of people from the Bible and from our own church family who have made a difference as they've allowed God to work through them.

I look forward to seeing you in July and hearing how God has moved through our church family to impact lives for the Gospel—at home, at work, at church, and everywhere in between!

#### **OUR GREAT COMMISSION FUND**


Each year, Houston's First Baptist Church adopts an annual operating budget—our Great Commission Fund. The budget helps the church to conduct ministry while maintaining accountability and stewardship over the resources the Lord has entrusted us with through the generosity of the Houston's First family and other contributors to the ministry of our church.

The budget process for fiscal year 2019–2020 started in February with five individuals from Financial Services and Operations reviewing three years of actual expenditures for approximately 60 church departments/ministries. Meetings were then conducted with the departments/ministries to determine the budget for the fiscal year running July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020. This resulted in a review of over 1.600 income and expense accounts.

Once the budget was approved at the senior staff level, it was submitted to the Finance Committee for discussion and approval. Following their approval on May 22, the budget was sent to the Deacon body for their consideration. After the Deacons approve the budget, members of the church are invited to vote on the budget at the monthly Church Conference to be held on Wed, June 5, at 7:30p in the Oasis Room at The Loop Campus.






